TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 21, PROVIDING FOR THE OPERATION OF A MUNICIPAL WATERWORKS SYSTEM IN THE CITY OF LAKE PARK, GEORGIA; A SUPERINTENDENT OF SAID SYSTEM, THE MANNER OF OPERATION OF THE SAME, THE RATES TO BE CHARGED FOR WATER TO USERS; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES;

THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAKE PARK, GEORGIA HEREBY ORDAINS THE FOLLOWING SECTIONS OF ORDINANCE NO. 21 BE AMENDED AS FOLLOWS;


Section 1. Pursuant to the provisions set forth by Ordinance No. 21, and under Section 30, rates, the Governing Body hereby amends Section 30, rates to read as follows:

Minimum rate (0-2,000) gallons 15.50

All other provisions of Ordinance No. 21 remain as previously adopted.

ORDINANCE NO. 116

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LAKE PARK, GEORGIA

To amend certain provisions of Article II, Division 3 of the Charter of the City of Lake Park ("the City Charter") to amend Section 2.30 regarding the term of office of the mayor pro tem, and for other purposes,

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Lake Park and it is hereby ORDAINED by the authority thereof:

I.

Section 2.30 of the City Charter is amended by deleting the last paragraph of Sec. 2.30 and replacing it with the following:

Following the induction of members, the council by majority vote of all the members thereof shall elect one of their number to be mayor pro tem, who shall serve for a term of two years or until the expiration of the mayor pro tem's term of office on city council, whichever shall first occur. In the event the office of mayor pro tem shall become vacant, the council shall by majority vote elect a new mayor pro tem who shall serve out the unexpired balance of the outgoing mayor pro tem's two year term.

II.

All other provisions of the City Charter shall remain in full force and effect except as amended hereby.


III.

NOTICE OF INTENT TO AMEND THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF LAKE PARK, GEORGIA

Amendment to Municipal Charter

Pursuant to the home rule powers granted to municipalities under O.C.G.A. §36-35-3(b), the City of Lake Park intends to introduce an ordinance to amend Section 2.30 of the City Charter regarding the term of office of the mayor pro tem. The proposed amendment to the Charter is as follows:

Section 2.30 of the City Charter is amended by deleting the last paragraph of Sec. 2.30 and replacing it with the following:

Following the induction of members, the council by majority vote of all the members thereof shall elect one of their number to be mayor pro tem, who shall serve for a term of two years or until the expiration of the mayor pro tem's term of office on city council, whichever shall first occur. In the event the office of mayor pro tem shall become vacant, the council shall by majority vote elect a new mayor pro tem who shall serve out the unexpired balance of the outgoing mayor pro tem's two year term.



5 fire calls:

1 Vehicle accident

2 fire alarms (1 in city, 1 in county)

1 Medical Assist

1 Mutual aid call (Structure fire Echols County)

Community events we attended:

Lake Park and Lowndes County Fire Rescue Station 3 (Twin Lakes) teamed up and did the Christmas Eve Santa run, Santa Claus gave out candy canes to the kids.

Fire department Issues:

Rescue 1 has been down for several weeks (won't start) our emergency vehicle technician is coming this weekend to see what's wrong. This truck has had several repairs trying to keep it running and becoming a recurring problem.

Engine 1 built in generator is down and this effects the light tower and all electrical outlets on the truck we might need. Truck had electrical short in the console resulting in a small fire over Christmas weekend and has been repaired.

Fire Department central air conditioner is down (outside compressor unit is bad) unit is 17 years old.

Grants:

We will again apply for both GMA Grant (3000.00) and FEMA (unknown amount at this time)
