Subject: Site Inspection Summary for 300 N. Railroad Ave

Dear Ms. Fowler:

I met Jeff Patterson, Carl Taylor, and Tom Barr at the Lake Park Area Historical Society and Museum on Friday, April 27 at 1p.m. and was asked to review the stormwater drainage along N. Railroad Ave and N. Lawrence St. Based on visual observations, stormwater generally flows south down the right-of-way of N. Lawrence St. and east down the right-of-way of N. Railroad Ave. to a grate inlet at the northwest corner of the intersection. There is no curb and gutter on the streets and neither right-of-way has a well-defined swale. The building's roof drains to the north with a small awning in the front that drains to the south. There are no gutters or downspouts on the building.

I was informed that the building owner is concerned that stormwater from the street is causing the brick pavers that were installed about 10 years ago to settle unevenly in several places. It was observed that the pavers in the front of the building have been completely removed and there are several places along the side of the building that have settled and are uneven. It was also observed that there did not appear to be a concrete base poured to support the pavers.

Mr. Patterson indicated the settling of the pavers occurred prior to any changes or improvements being made to the streets or rights-of-way in this area. After the owner expressed their concerns about the drainage to the City, grading was recently completed by the City on the west side of N. Lawrence St. in an effort to improve drainage. The recent grading still did not appear to create a well-defined swale. The roof drainage appears to be ponding at the back of the building because there is not positive drainage away from the back of the building.

The pavers appeared to have been constructed without addressing existing drainage patterns at the time of construction. It should be possible to improve drainage along both streets by converting one side of the grate inlet to an open weir. This will allow both rights-of-way to be regraded to provide well-defined swales. LEA is prepared to survey this intersection and provide a design for these improvements at your request.

ORDINANCE NO. 118

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LAKE PARK, GEORGIA

To amend certain provisions of Chapter 9, Article I of the Code of the City of Lake Park Georgia ("the City Code") to add a new Section 9-9 to prohibit boating on the waters of Tom's Pond, and for other purposes,

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Lake Park and it is hereby ORDAINED by the authority thereof:

I.

A new Section 9-9 is added to the City Code as follows:


Section 9-9. Boating in Tom's Pond



- (a) Except as hereinafter provided, no person shall operate a boat of any kind, whether motor driven or manually powered, on the waters of Tom's Pond. Violators shall be subject to punishment as provided in Code Section 1-8.
- (b) The prohibitions in subsection (a) of this Section shall not apply to those portions of Tom's Pond owned by property owners whose property directly abuts the shoreline of Tom's Pond, as evidenced by a duly recorded deed, provided that such use of the waters of Tom's Pond shall be limited to the portion of the pond actually owned by the abutting property owner.

I have been asked whether, and if so, to what extent, the city is liable for damage on private property at 300 N. Railroad Avenue which the property owner claims was caused by surface water runoff from the city street. Generally, the city has no liability for damage from the flow of surface water unless the damage is the direct result of actions by the city which have altered the natural water flow. In other words, the city would not be liable for water runoff damage unless the city did something to divert surface water from its natural path and concentrate it on a neighboring property, resulting in damage.

Washouts or other damage resulting from normal runoff from water following its normal path off a preexisting city street would not be the city's responsibility to repair.

In this case, it appears from the engineer's report that there are multiple drainage issues at work. Stormwater is running off the street and is also draining off the roof and pooling around the building due to a lack of gutters and downspouts and no positive drainage away from the building. I can't tell what damage has been caused by any particular problem. The engineer notes that it appears the drainage issues existed before the pavers were installed 10 years ago. It does not appear that the water flow off the street is the result of new grading or any other action by the city that caused it to be concentrated on the owner's property. I have a call in to the engineer to see if he can make that determination.

There is no clear liability for the city. There appear to be issues with how the pavers were initially installed (no concrete base to support them) and there is no indication the city changed the grade of the road or did anything else to concentrate water flow onto the property. There were no ditches, swales, pipes or other drainage structures on the east side of the street. Any corrective drainage work appears to have been done on the west side, away from the building. In the absence of action by the city which changed the natural water flow, the city would not be responsible for correcting drainage issues and damage on private property.

If the city elects to take responsibility for fixing all or part of the drainage issues, I would not recommend using city workers or community service people to do work on private property for liability reasons.

§ 6:33. Public liability for water damage

Municipalities, counties, and state agencies may incur liability for water damage suffered by property owners as a result of their activities in dealing with surface waters, streams, or lakes. Thus, a city or county constructing or maintaining a public road or street must take care not to throw surface water into adjoining private lands.1 Where a county channeled surface water into a private lake, it was held responsible in damages to its owner, 2 although such an obligation was said not to require it to repair and maintain the lake.3 Construction of roads and highways invariably involves drainage problems through changes in grade4 and diversion of the natural flow of water5 with resulting liability in damages.
