The Lowndes County Board of Commissioners heard <u>REZ-2017-09</u> on <u>September 26, 2017</u>, and **APPROVED** the applicant's request to rezone ~126 acres from its original zoning classification of R-1 (Low Density Residential) to R-10 (Suburban Density Residential). The Motion was approved via a Three-Two (3-2) vote with the followings **conditions**:

- 1. The minimum lot size is 14,520 square feet or 1/3 acre lots:
- 2. Lots front interior roads;
- 3. Manufactured homes or mobile homes are not allowed;
- 4. Two-family or duplexes are not allowed;
- 5. Instead of 13.7 acres of C-G (General Commercial) zoning the property shall be zoned R-10 (Suburban Density Residential) with the same conditions.



Section 5.6-2.a and Section 5.6-2.b. ARE NOT ORDINANCE WORTHY SECTIONS.

An ordinance is legislation and laws set up AND mandated by the local government. These job descriptions are best served as part of the Advisory Committee By-Laws.

- If these sections are to be included in the ordinance, then the Council should include in the ordinance a means to enforce these sections. <u>These sections become laws.</u>
- 2. Each section becomes LITERAL IN ITS MEANING.

Sec. 5.6-1. ...create and establish a trust fund..."

- 1. What happened to the Toms Pond Veterans Memorial Fund?
- 2. Why is the Veterans Memorial Fund not listed with appropriate limits to how the monies are used?
- 3. Is the Veterans Memorial Fund being renamed as the "trust fund"?
- 4. If so, is it the intent of Council to allow "building improvements, utilities, maintenance, event planning, and city community activities" to be funded from the Veterans Memorial Fund?

Sec. 5.6-1. "...separate fund accounts".

1. Who decides the establishment of a separate fund account?

Sec. 5.6-2.a. Committee Chairman..... "Other duties of Committee Chairman MAY include but are not limited to...."

- 1. Why is this section included if it is considered optional (the use of the word "may") duties?
- Sec. 5.6-2a. "....in accordance with the Georgia Open Meetings Act...."
 - 1. The members of the committee are volunteers. They are not trained in the requirements set down by the GA Open Meetings Act, therefore know that if the meetings are not held in accordance with this state law, it falls on the shoulders of the Mayor and City Council. I would suggest that a member of Council, in a non-voting capacity, be included in the appointed trustees and present at all meetings to insure that all meetings are held within those GA state mandated meeting requirements.

Sec. 5.6-2.b. "...this team is in charge of gathering and organizing ALL THE ITEMS FOR THE EVENT..."

- 1. Unless a committee member has access to large equipment, THIS IS NOT POSSIBLE.
- 2. "...clean up"
- 3. "...develop and plan fundraisers to pay for events...." So according to this revision of Ordinance 114, the committee members are legally responsible planning and executing 6 events, 2 recreation areas, <u>AND</u> Fundraising activities, as well. (Sec. 5.6-3.) Again, Council is legislating volunteers.

Sec. 5.6-3."...events and/or activities include but are not limited to ..."

RE: Proposed revision to Lake Park City Ordinance 114.

Is this to mean that Council can continue to add to the list of events as they determine?
 E.G. mule races, chili cook-off, yo-yo tournament.....the list can go on and on, because Council will have the authority to INCLUDE whatever and as many activities that they want without consideration of the VOLUNTEER committee members and their personal lives.

***THE ANSWER IS YES....BECAUSE AN ORDINANCE IS A LAW.

Sec. 5.6-4. "...any gifts or donations....shall be deposited in the trust fund."

1. What about gifts/donations that were given with a specific project? Are they deposited into the general trust fund?

All other City Committee Chairman responsibilities and duties are not listed as part of the ordinances that cover the Ethics Committee, Cemetary Committee and the Board of Zoning Appeals.
